THE 3 Rs

When it comes to environmental impact, even small efforts to reduce waste, recycle and reuse products saves resources, energy and money.

REDUCE

- Buy products in concentrate or bulk
- Repair and maintain equipment
- Use more durable products
- Buy items made from recycled materials
- Remove your name from junk-mail lists

REUSE

- Reuse cloth, paper or plastic bags when shopping

- Use flatware or reusable plastic items for parties (collect in a separate bin)
