



How Do I Know Which Roads and Trails Are Open to e-Bikes on The National Forest?



Designated and available motorized routes are shown on the Motor Vehicle Use Map. Only those trails or roads on the map



Even though a route may be posted with a route number, unless it is on the Motor Vehicle Use Map, it is closed to motorized use.

The e-Bike operator is legally responsible for knowing the motorized travel regulations as shown on the Motor Vehicle Use Map (MVUM).

- If a route is open it will be shown in two ways: The MVUM and a numbered sign on the road or trail.
- Any route not shown on the MVUM is CLOSED to e-Bike use
- Be aware of Seasonal Closures noted in the MVUM key
- Open routes have numbers signs. However, closed routes do not always have signs or gates closing them to use.

Traveling on unauthorized roads, trails or areas is in violation of 16 USC 551 CFR36.261.13 and could result in a \$5,000.00 fine and/or 6 months imprisonment.



The goal is to provide motorized and non-motorized recreation experiences. Your help in achieving a balance is important. Routes are subject to re-evaluation every year. Contact your local Ranger District if you want to be involved.
